Credentialing

To practice nationally (in all states except Alaska), Respiratory Therapists must hold a valid Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT) or Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT) credential from the National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC). Upon successful completion of the A.S. Respiratory Therapy program, students will be eligible to take the NBRC credentialing exams. More information available at www.nbrc.org.
